

Butts Out(side)

Great news! You and your problem-solving teammates are going to work together to find a strategy for addressing an environmental issue involving tobacco and cannabis waste.



Here's the problem:

Tobacco and cannabis are legal substances for adults to use. But consumers often discard their butts and roaches in ways that harm the environment and animals.

According to National Geographic (August 2019):

"Cigarette butts are the top plastic polluters, with an estimated two-thirds of the trillions of filters used each year tossed into the environment. A recent study found that cigarette butts inhibit plant growth. They also routinely get into waterways, and eventually oceans."

According to the B.C. SPCA:

"THC, the psychoactive component of pot, can cause "seizures, coma and even death" in pets." (CTV news report, May 28, 2020)

Here's the assignment:

What can we do to keep butts out of oceans and roaches out of animals? Research

- Start with the 5 W's (who, what, where, when, why)
- What else do you need to know? Where can you find answers?
- How can you use primary research to learn more? (e.g., surveys, field research)

Collect and collate

- Gather information
- Identify key facts, themes, audience and narrative
- Identify creative ways of keeping butts and roaches out of oceans and animals

Tip: Keep in mind that tobacco and cannabis are legal substances for adult use and that stigmatizing users is unlikely to promote behaviour change.



Activity steps

- 1. Divide the group into teams of up to 4.
- 2. Tell the youth they will be working on a project that helps the environment and animals. If desired, you could read aloud the problem:
